I know many people think that their dog is the smartest or sweetest or liveliest of all. Corky was in fact just that. Sadly, Corky died last May just two weeks short of her 16th birthday. My heart was broken.

Corky caught my eye, so to speak, even before she was whelped. I had been re-searching whippets for some time and had my eye on Drake as quite a handsome possible sire. I was able to attend the National in San Diego and fell in love with the pretty little puppy girls bred by Dianne Bowen. When I learned that Dianne had a girl in whelp to Drake, I went on a campaign to get a puppy from that litter and ultimately Corky came home with me.

Over the next several years Corky and I embarked on so many adventures. She went to a lure coursing event as a young pup and was instantly and permanently made mad for the lure. We had great times lure coursing at which she was very good and also racing which she loved even though she was careful not to get her twenty pounds in the crazy mix at the end of larger dogs and so never won a single race, that I can recall.

Corky was kind enough to put up with obedience just to please me though she managed to get a few antics into that ring. And obedience led to tracking and ultimately agility both of which she loved. Other sports followed in time.

Corky took a brief respite from all the fuss to have a rendezvous with the very handsome Smoke. My Big Mo is from that litter as are several others that are very accomplished and well loved.

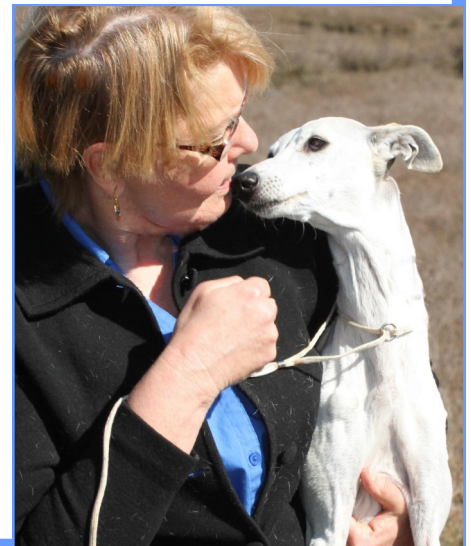
But she was a career girl at heart and was soon back at it. Corky never met a dog or person that she did not like. She greeted all graciously and loved flirting with the boys.

As the more active sports were retired from her repertoire, she took up others. Her last years she specialized in nose work at which she also shone. And she became a careful babysitter, coming to tattle whenever she judged any dog or child was doing something wrong.

Never was there a whippet with more heart in both the loving and the courageous meaning. Two days before Corky died we went to her nose work class. Although her health had faded, she went at it with her usual gusto and tried to resist leaving the field when it was time. That was the last time I saw her tail wag. Corky died two days later.

Titles and ribbons are mementos of good times and we had many of those. There will never be another Corky.

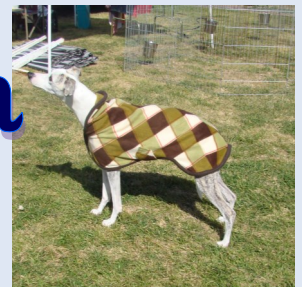

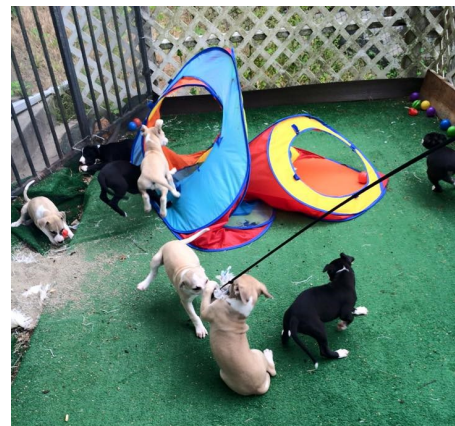
